## PART-TIME FACULTY LECTURER POSITION IN MINING ENGINEERING

The Department of Mining and Materials Engineering at McGill University invites applications for a part-time, three-year, faculty lecturer position in Mining Engineering. The expected appointment start date is September 1, 2019. The salary will be commensurate with experience.

The Department is home to two programs – Mining Engineering and Materials Engineering. Mining is housed in the ADAMS Building, and has excellent facilities with strong activities in several research areas. The Department is committed to excellence in teaching at both undergraduate and graduate levels, and values service to the Department, Faculty, and University, as well as service to the profession and society at large. The successful candidate will play a leading role in maintaining McGill's international reputation in teaching.

### **RESPONSIBILITIES**

The position involves teaching responsibilities. Duties performed by the Part-Time Faculty Lecturer include (but are not limited to) the following.

- Teaching core undergraduate courses.
- Ensuring that course content and delivery maintain high academic standards.
- Providing leadership in teaching/learning activities, identifying appropriate assessment tools for each course, and maintaining high academic standards.
- Review of course evaluations and identification of areas for improvement.
- Ensuring university and departmental policies, guidelines and procedures are met.

### **EDUCATION/EXPERIENCE REQUIRED**

- Candidates must have a Ph.D. preferably with a degree in mining engineering and evidence of outstanding teaching achievements.
- Candidates having teaching experience in the following areas are strongly encouraged to apply. These are: Mine Surveying, Mining Geotechnics, Rock Mechanics, and Underground Mining.
- Preferred qualifications include dedication to an environment that supports diversity of population and perspectives. As our students come from diverse cultures and backgrounds, we invite candidates to address in their application their ability to teach and mentor in this context.
- Membership or eligibility for membership in a Canadian professional engineering association is required.

## **TERM OF APPOINTMENT**

This is a part-time ranked academic, non-tenure track position with an initial appointment of three (3) years.
